Founded in 1981, Exultate Chamber Singers is an adult mixed-voice chamber choir located in the heart of downtown Toronto. The ensemble is enriched not only by the strong musicianship of its members but also by their varied ages, cultural backgrounds, and academic and professional credentials. Together they form a passionate, committed ensemble with a wideranging repertoire.

The choir is a three-time winner of the Healey Willan Grand Prize in the CBC National Radio Competition and was most recently awarded first place in the chamber choir category of Choral Canada's 2019 National Competition for Canadian Amateur Choirs.

In addition to presenting its annual concert series, Exultate has made regular appearances around Ontario, toured in Canada, collaborated with dozens of artists, released six albums, and enjoyed airplay on CBC Radio. Exultate's most recent album, At First Light, showcases Canadian choral music commissioned by the choir in recent years.

Mark Ramsay is Assistant Professor and Coordinator of Choral Activities at the Don Wright Faculty of Music at Western University. Prior to his appointment at Western University, Dr. Ramsay was Adjunct Professor at the University of Toronto, Faculty of Music. He frequently appears as a guest conductor, adjudicator, and clinician.



Mark holds a Doctor of Musical Arts in choral conducting from U of T where he was a student of Dr. Hilary Apfelstadt. His doctoral thesis focused on Canadian choral repertoire written specifically for tenor/bass voices. In addition, he holds a Master of Music from U of T and a Bachelor of Music Education from University of Prince Edward Island.

OUR GUESTS

Concreamus is a 50-voice new music choir dedicated to innovation in the choral arts and the creation and performance of excellent new works by young composers. The group is made up of singers, students, composers, and educators from around the GTA.

Concreamus, Latin for "we create together," encourages a creative dialogue between composers and performers, through which both groups can offer their insight and be inspired in new ways.

Over the span of three seasons, the choir has premiered more than 25 choral works by early-career composers. Concreamus has collaborated with various musical organizations, including appearing in concert with the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, the Green Room Music Collective, and at SING! Festival Toronto.

Kai Leung holds a Bachelor of Music from the University of Toronto, where he studied voice and composition. He is the Artistic Director of Modern Sound Collective, where he conducts Concreamus, Sehnsucht, and Frisson.

He also serves as the Associate Conductor with Orpheus Choir of Toronto, the Assistant Conductor with Toronto Youth Choir and TCC's Coro, and as the Assistant Conductor and Composer in Residence at St. Clement's Church. Kai sings baritone with TMSingers and Schola Cantorum of Saint Basil's Catholic Church. Kai is also the conductor and choir manager of Toronto Festival Singers, the professional synagogue choir at Song Shul.
